As you requested, Sandra Seely was administered a polygraph examination on August 4, 2003. Below you will find the official results of the examination.

### CASE DETAILS

Prior to the examination Mr. Alloju provided a copy of the Child Protective Service Case #24705779. In this case it is indicated that Alexandria Myers, who is commonly called Lexi, has suffered from Shaken Baby Syndrome. Lexi was in the care of her maternal grandparents, Wesley and Sandra Seely, in October 2002 and was taken to the hospital. Several days later it was determined by physicians that she had retinal bleeding, which is one of the indicators of Shaken Baby Syndrome.

I spoke with the Attorney ad litem, Brad Clark, who indicated that his concerns were whether or not Mr. or Mrs. Seely had shaken Lexi, or if they possibly knew who had. Finally, Mr. Clark was concerned with whether or not they had been truthful about the people who had access to Lexi during the days that they had her in their custody.

### PRETEST STATEMENT

Ms. Seely indicated that on July 17, 2002, Lexi was born. She was a twin and the other twin, Shelby, died several days after the birth. Lexi was very premature and weighed less than two pounds. On October 11, 2002, Lexi was released from the hospital to Mr. & Mrs. Seely. She could not go to her parents, Lee Myers and Chrissy Seely, because both were indicated for injury to other children. Three days after they received Lexi, Chrissy went on trial and was sentenced to twelve years in prison. During the trial, Ms. Seely indicated that Lexi was baby sat by Megan, who is Chrissy's sister, Crystal Barth,

who is the paternal great-grandmother and Nadine Seely, who is the maternal great-grandmother. Ms. Seely stated that no one else had access to her that she is aware of.

Ms. Seely stated on October 28, 2002, at about 2:00 a.m., Lexi's monitor went off. She stated she got up and jostled her and she started breathing. She stated at 2:25 a.m. it went off again. She stated she didn't breath and she turned the light on and she was turning blue. She stated she jostled her and then took her to the kitchen and started doing CPR. She stated that Lexi started breathing almost immediately.

Ms. Seely stated her husband, Wes, was out doing his newspaper job and she called him. She stated at 2:50 a.m. they took Lexi to the hospital. She stated she went into ICU and had numerous tests. She stated it was initially thought to be a viral infection. She said they did CAT Scans and lots of other tests. She said 11 days later, during an eye examination, Dr. Norman indicated that she had hemorrhaging and it looked like Shaken Baby. Ms. Seely stated she is absolutely certain she never shook Lexi. She stated Lexi only weighed just over four pounds. She indicated that she has no knowledge of anyone shaking Lexi and has been truthful about who kept Lexi.


### RELEVANT QUESTIONS

1. Did you shake Lexi? . . . "No".
2. Do you know of anyone shaking Lexi? . . . "No".
3. Besides the three we discussed, while in your care do you know of anyone else keeping Lexi? . . . "No".

### RESULTS

Utilizing a Zone of Comparison Technique, a polygraph examination was constructed and administered to Ms. Seely using the above relevant questions. Evaluation of the polygrams failed to reveal criteria indicative of deception to the relevant questions. It is the examiner's opinion that Ms. Seely was being truthful to the relevant questions.
